The day will start at 9.30am with a cup of tea or coffee and a homemade morning tea supplied by Federation.

At 10am we get into our craft demonstrations these can be hands on and there will be kits to purchase so you can watch and then go home and complete your article.

Sashiko requirements

Kit cost - Fabric square, a couple of metres of thread and some patterns with basic instructions - \$6 Diane will do a demonstration of this technique but if members wish to try it out, they will need to bring scissors, sharp needles and a 6-inch embroidery hoop.

Dorset buttons -

cost of the kits will be \$4 including four rings and some copied instructions.

They will need to bring their own embroidery cotton or Perle 5 thread as well as a needle as I do not have enough needles.

Art cards:

People can make these on the day if they wish and will need fancy papers, serviette, lace and ribbons, buttons, sequins, etc. If you wish to choose a paper for the theme birthday celebration everything else can be related to this. A paintbrush for applying PVA glue. Also, there will be background stamps, stencils. 3 D glimmer paste, baby wipes. Also, you can bring pretty napkins, lace scraps, paper scraps buttons and decals if you have them.

Felt Christmas Decorations:

You will need felts for Faye has some if you do not color cottons decorations e.g., Sequins, buttons' lace and other bits and pieces for decorating also you will need shapes Faye has hearts, Christmas tree and circles glue gun and craft glue. If you would like a copy of the Mandella coloring competition printed, please let us know before the day.

If you have any other crafts, you would like help with, bring it along if its in the Creative Arts Day program. Also please bring your supplies of crafts if you have them for your entries. Any other enquiries contact Diane Lithgow.
